Use of Pupil Premium 2011 - 2012

Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. In 2012 - 13, eligibility for the Pupil Premium will be extended to pupils who have been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last 6 years.

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support children from low income families. From September 2012, schools are required to publish online information about how they have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

Support & Curriculum Focus

Targeted Support

1-1 Support in English and Mathematics - by an additional Teacher
Intervention groups by Teaching Assistants

Family Support Worker

Families have been supported through the writing of CAFs and provision of guidance on a range of areas; punctuality, routine, behaviour.

Impact - Children and families have taken part in specialised courses, developed strategies which have benefited the whole family.

Impact - Children from disadvantaged backgrounds have had the opportunity to develop their skills and enjoyed the social aspect that belonging to a club entails. It has improved their sense of self worth and wellbeing.
